RENDHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWSLETTER

At every PC meeting there is a 15 minutes' Public Forum at the beginning of the meeting in which villagers can raise matters. All are welcome. It is important that everyone is able to show interest in what's going on in the village and make a contribution.

Mr. Bill Carter attended the meeting and raised the problem of Septic tanks and the increasing water table, problems with emptying and drainage.

He asked if the Parish Council would approach Anglian Water to ask for an assessment to determine whether a duty exists to provide public sewerage. It was agreed that the clerk would write to the company.

Tree Warden's Report - from Cllr. Gleeson - full report on the website

There is again and increased interest in orcharding. Not just establishing new community orchards but reviving old ones and grafting old fruit types onto new rootstock. It was with this in mind that I attended a Fruit Tree Grafting Course with Paul Read (famous around these parts for this). If anyone has experience with this, I'd be delighted for you to let me know. It's not rocket science at the beginner's end but it's definitely a valuable skill and requires a special talent.

Maybe hidden in villager's gardens are old, new or particularly delicious fruits trees. Next autumn appropriate rootstock could be obtained and grafting commenced if there is any interest. You don't even need to know what they are called! Nowadays you can take it to an apple or other fruit identification day, consult with a fledgling database which is getting better every year or send a few leaves in spring for DNA analysis and be communicated the results within weeks. If your fruit tree is unique you can even name it!

The Knoll

It was agreed to replace the small post around the Knoll to protect the green. Adding reflectors on the three corners. Cllr. Bennion is leading the project along with other villagers.

PARK

Cllr. Field tabled the updated copy of the constitution. Following, a discussion it was agreed. He also stated that more information about the Queen's Jubilee would be circulated soon.

Speed Check on B1119

We are still waiting to hear from the SCC Cllr. Stephen Burroughs about the results of the speed check on vehicles coming into the Village. However, the PC were not happy about the placement of the Speed Check and the clerk has written to the Cllr. to see if it could be moved

RENDHAM VILLAGE HALL - ALL OUR YESTERDAYS, AND TODAY

From the handwritten minutes of a Rendham Village Hall Management Committee Meeting around this time in 1976, a discussion took place regarding the repair and purchase of chairs for the village hall. It was intimated that enquiry be made to purchase some from the Saxmundham Ex-Servicemen's Club who were upgrading their furniture. Another startling reported revelation was that two of the hall user groups (Playgroup and Good Companions) had swapped cupboards and the Playgroup was also now permitted to use some shelves. The fixtures mentioned clearly now longer exist having been removed during the last building refurbishment and likewise the Playgroup and Good Companions no longer exist. The village hall at that time appeared to employ a caretaker. There had been a complaint about his use of bad language in front of the Playgroup. The allegation was vehemently denied! Also recorded is the intention to ask the caretaker's wife to wash the village hall teacloths and for this task she was to be offered the princely sum of 25p per week.

THE START OF 2022 saw the gradual removal of COVID restrictions that applied to community buildings although the general observance of "Hand, Face, and Space" is encouraged.

The Committee will continue to observe our running costs with regard to the huge increase in electricity as our fixed term power contract comes to an end in May. The replacement of the heating system is our project over the coming months.

THE BUTLEY FERRY

On Easter Saturday (16 April 2022) the Butley Ferry will open for passengers. The ferry service, run as a large rowing boat, is available for walkers and cyclists and links the footpaths at Gedgrave Marshes at Orford with Capel St Andrew and Butley.

There are several circular walks around the area.

This is a very special area of Suffolk with a fantastic variety of birds egrets, curlews, oystercatchers. Last year we had a pair of spoonbills on the RSPB reserve nearby. You may even see seals in the river



The ferry is open from 11.00am to 4.00pm at weekends and bank holidays if you are organising a group and need the ferry during the week please contact us on 07913672449 to see if a ferryman will be available.

We think the ferry was started by the Augustin monks when they acquired the land at Butley and Orford. We know that in 1383 the ferry was moved to the present site. The records are not complete but we think the ferry has been in pretty continuous use ever since.

Last year the ferry team were awarded the Queens Award for Voluntary Service.
