SHCT BIKE RIDE SATURDAY 8 SEPT - 09:00 - 17:00



RENDHAM MUMMERS

BROTHERS IN ARMS RENDHAM WHITE HORSE, BANK HOLIDAY MONDAY 27 AUGUST, 12.30PM

1418, villagers gather to celebrate the birth of the Oak Moon. Festivities are abruptly interrupted by the Earl of Suffolk, William de la Pole, who having received a Call to Arms from King Henry V (of Agincourt fame) is required to 'recruit' soldiers for the ongoing war in France. Sadly, he has little choice but to press into service a motley crew of peasant Mummings.

Rendham Mummings (or Guisers as they are sometimes called) seek to entertain and maintain the traditions of this unique form of street theatre, which dates back to medieval times. The blacking/masking of the faces reflects the belief held that they would be cursed by the Devil should they be recognised.

All proceeds from the Hat Collection at the end of the performance is being donated to *Fresh Start - new beginnings*, a Norfolk & Suffolk Children's Charity which provides a therapeutic service for victims of child sexual abuse. *The Speaker*

DO YOU KNOW ABOUT THE 62 BUS?



The 62 bus runs weekly on Wednesdays. It links Saxmundham, Rendham, Sweffling, Framlingham, Wickham Market and Woodbridge and back. It is a 16 seater minibus (PF Travel) and the driver is most amenable, helping people as much as he can. To get to Woodbridge the bus leaves Rendham at 1314 & you have to change at Wickham Market (not difficult). The return bus stops at Rendham Church at 1804, leaving Woodbridge at 1725 (no change). 
