RENDHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWSLETTER - MAY 2019

Every four years the Parish Council has to hold an election. Following the uncontested election the following Cllr's were elected - Cllr's Willett, Gleeson, Bennion, Croucher, Field, Lawrence, Morford and Strachan

Parish Meeting - As with previous years, reports were received from the various groups within the Parish. This year reports were received from Chairman of the Parish Council, PC Finance report, Amenity Fund finance report, PCC, ACC, PARK, Neighbourhood Watch, Village Hall Management Committee and Village Website. Reports were also received from the SCC Cllr. and the District Cllr's. Reports will be available to read in the minutes on the village website.

Annual Parish Council Meeting - Cllr. Willett was duly elected as Chairman with Cllr. Gleeson as Vice Chairman.

PC Council Finance - The year end reports were discussed and agreed. The Internal audit was carried out by John Carrington and thanks were given. He carries out the work free of charge. (Both on the Parish Council and the Amenity Fund). The various audit papers are published on the Parish Council page of the village website.

PARK - Cllr. Field, with the PARK committee, has written a draft constitution for the running and use of PARK which will be circulated to the Parish Council before being published.

Rendham Green - It was decided that following the work carried out on the Green over the winter, at the September and November Parish Council meetings, the planting of new British native trees will be discussed.

Vivienne Stevens 1929 – 2019

Vivienne was born in Bexley, Kent in June 1929, and always loved the Spring. Ten years old when WWII was declared, Vivienne was evacuated, but when her parents went to Herne Bay on a family break they decided it would be a good place to live, and the family spent happy years there. She worked hard at school and got her School Certificate, and after leaving school worked on a couple of farms. There were two educational opportunities that Vivienne was unable to take up. She

gained a scholarship to St Martin's Art School and, in contrast, also had a place at Aberystwyth to study agriculture, but the latter was needed for men when they returned from the war. Her love of colour and sense of design came out in the quilts she designed and sewed later on in her life.

In 1950 her family decided to emigrate to New Zealand, and this ushered in a romantic, adventurous and happy period of her life. A young man called Cyril Stevens came on two weekends to deal with the sale of the family home working with her brother Nigel. Cyril and Vivienne fell for each other and wrote to each other for the first two years that she was in New Zealand, until Cyril was able to obtain passage on board ship. Cyril disembarked in New Zealand in June 1950, and they were married on All Saints' Day, at the start of November

Vivienne worked as a Herd Tester in NZ, visiting many dairy farms to assess the butterfat content of the jersey milk. Then after working in an office came a happy period of family life with Vivienne (Vivi-Jane), Richard and Jonathan. When Cyril decided to enter the ministry she supported him as he studied. After a short period back in the UK during the years after his ordination, they returned back for good in 1969 and Cyril became Rector of Sweffling and Rendham. Esther, their only English baby appeared on the scene. Vivienne was always involved in church and village life, supporting it in many ways as Rector's Wife including Trustee, Mothers' Union, sewing, baking, hospitality, committees. Vivienne also worked with her son Jonathan in his business, Sweffling Furniture, becoming a skilled and meticulous French Polisher, whether reproduction oak, contemporary finishes or a deep patina on mahogany.

It was 1993 when Cyril and Vivienne came to live in Marlesford, and soon became part of village life. All her life Vivienne was a committed Christian and attended church at St Andrew's. Once the community cafe was set up, Vivienne was a regular attender, immaculately dressed - she had such a sense of style. Vivienne had a wonderful sense of humour and so often had a smile on her face. We shall miss her greatly.
